Middletown Police Update, Chief Herman

Chief Herman gave an update regarding the events in February. MPD has hired 5 new officers and are now 24/7.

Ordinance 02-13-20-A, 19ZONE0057, Urton Lane Senior Apts., 108 Urton Lane, second reading

Marv Blomquist was here representing the applicant. They have made the changes that were requested from the last meeting. They have added parking and are now up to 150 spaces, added a fire lane, and the crosswalk will connect to the west side of Meridian.
